PROJECT DETAILS

The 2024 street improvement project will include storm water improvements, minor watermain maintenance, approximately 30% curb and gutter and sidewalk replacement on the city streets and complete pavement replacement. Proposed street improvements are intended to take place within the right of way.

AWARDED BID

Bituminous Roadways, based out of Mendota Heights, Minnesota, was awarded the project during the May 7th, 2024 City Council Meeting. Bituminous Roadway's bid was \$1,735,766.

PRELIMINARY SCHEDULE

Construction on the Bridgeview Shores Street Improvements Project is scheduled to begin on **June 17th, 2024**. When concluded, property owners will have upgraded streets that should serve them well for years to come. City Staff and the contractor have established the following timetable for construction activities (keep in mind that it's highly dependent on cooperative weather). Generally, the contractor will tackle the improvements in this order:

Erosion Control & Removals	Begins week of June 17 th
Utilities (Storm Sewer and Watermain)	Begins week of June 24 th
Reclaim Existing Roadway	Begins week of July 1 st
Concrete Curb and Gutter & Sidewalks	Begins week of July 15 th
Paving & Restoration	Begins Early August

Construction and project schedule updates will be available for viewing on the project's website below including a brief outlook towards planned construction activities for subsequent weeks.

ACCESS TO HOUSES

The contractor must provide access to all houses throughout the duration of the project. However, there may be minor temporary closures throughout the day, with roads being opened back up by the end of the workday.

PRIVATE UTILITY WORK

For this project, the private utilities are remaining in place and not being disturbed or relocated in any manner. If a problem should arise, the contractor will contact the appropriate company to determine a solution. There are no planned disruptions.

RIGHT OF WAY

All public streets in Mendota Heights are constructed on dedicated right of way. This land was dedicated to the city during the platting process of a subdivision for the purpose of constructing and maintaining public utilities, roadways and walkways. Dedicated right of way varies in width around the city depending on when the lot was platted and the intended use of the right of way.

In Mendota Heights, the right of way is typically located about 13-24' behind the back of the curb but varies in the project area. Items in the existing right of way may include plants and flowers, landscaping, sprinklers and irrigation systems, invisible fences, mailboxes and other items. Some personal property affected by the construction maybe removed or damaged by the contractor. Property owners may want to relocate, clearly mark, or remove these items prior to construction beginning to minimize the risk of damage. The contractor will do their best to avoid damaging property in the right of way.

RESTORATION

Mendota Heights and Bituminous Roadways are taking every precaution to protect your property. In the event your yard or driveway is disturbed, sod replacement and driveway repairs will be made at the end of the project. If you see an issue in your yard, please contact your construction inspector so that we can review the situation.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

IS MY LANDSCAPING IN JEOPARDY OF BEING DAMAGED?

If the landscaping or sprinkler systems are within the right of way, it may be in jeopardy. Contact your construction inspector if you are concerned about your sprinkler system or landscaping. If it lies within about 3 feet of the existing roadway it could possibly be impacted. Please mark your sprinkler heads and other items in the right of way to avoid any unnecessary troubles. Marking flags are available for free at City Hall.

WHAT ABOUT MY MAILBOX?

The existing mailboxes for your project area will remain in-place throughout the duration of the project. If you notice damage to a mailbox, please report it to the construction inspector.



WHAT WILL BE THE HOURS OF CONSTRUCTION WORK?

Work will be done during the hours of 7:00 a.m. – 7:00 p.m. Monday through Friday and 9:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m. on Saturdays. You may see workers arrive before 7:00 a.m. preparing for work. It is our expectation that they will not start up equipment until after 7:00 am.

WHY IS THERE WHITE OR PINK PAINT ON MY DRIVEWAY?

Any white or pink paint that you see was painted by the construction inspector and signifies removal of curb and gutter or the driveway behind it. Please do not modify any markings you see on your property and try to replace utility marking flags (of all colors) that are displaced during mowing or yard work!

CAN I STILL PARK IN THE STREET?

You will be able to park in the street as permitted during construction. Residents will be asked to move vehicles during specific construction activities such as concrete work and paving efforts. Additional notifications will be sent prior to these time frames.

HOW CAN I STAY SAFE IN THE WORK ZONE?

Large construction equipment can have very poor sight lines. Please don't assume that the equipment operator can see you! Use care when driving near construction equipment. When driving, biking or walking in a work zone, please wait until a construction worker sees you and waves you through. Children can be very curious during construction projects. Please keep children away from the construction equipment and open trenches.

WHAT WILL HAPPEN IF A GAS LINE OR TELEPHONE LINE IS HIT?

During construction, private utilities may inadvertently be cut. Typically, the gas line involved is a small service line. The contractor will plug the line and call emergency crews to repair it. Due to the small size of the gas lines in this area, it is very unlikely that a cut gas line in this area will require an evacuation. If you notice a private utility failure, chances are the contractor is aware of the problem and is taking steps to correct the situation. You can also call the emergency numbers if you would like to report a failure.

WHAT IF I HAVE SPECIAL NEEDS?

If you have specific medical deliveries or special needs, please contact the construction inspector for coordination. Also, please call if you are planning any type of gathering such as a graduation party.

WHY ARE THERE STAKES IN MY YARD?

Some residents may notice wooden stakes in their front yards. Some of the stakes mark actual property corners staff found during the preliminary survey phase of the project. Other stakes mark survey control points for both preliminary and construction phases of the project. Additional stakes direct location and grade of the improvements. Please do not disturb them!
